#### **School Education Grant Program (gr. 3-12)**

Each school year, Oregon Archaeological Society offers grants to teachers grades 3-12 to provide educational experiences based on archaeology.

**Definition of Archaeology:** "The scientific study of the ancient and recent human past through material remains. The archaeological record consists of artifacts, structures, monuments, cultural landscape and other evidence of human activity."

#### **Application Process**

All completed applications *must include* specific written objectives pertaining to Archaeology (definition above) and how this will support curriculum and State Standards.

OAS will award a limited number of grants (max \$500.) to teachers grades 3-12 in public or publicly funded charter schools on an annual basis. Private school applications will be evaluated on a case by case basis. Grants are to be used to cover admissions, transportation, and program or speaker fees.

Properly completed grant applications will be reviewed by the OAS Board of Directors and the Education Committee. Recipients will be notified by email. **The last date for application is December 1st** and grants will be awarded by the end of January. Incomplete applications may be revised and resubmitted. Preference will be given to Title I Schools, or schools/classrooms with a significant percentage of disadvantaged students.

#### **Applicants must agree to:**

- Ensure students have signed a release form.
- Provide OAS with one or two photos of the experience and submit written teacher/student/class reflection or feedback on the trip. (e.g., journal pages, Thank You letters, etc.) These may be published in the online OAS newsletter "Screenings".
  - Failure to complete this step will disqualify any request for the following year.

#### The following criteria will be used in selecting grant recipients:

- How the proposed archaeology-based educational experience will contribute to students understanding and knowledge of cultures and cultural resources of the Pacific Northwest.
- Number of students participating
- How the grant money will be used
